The Administrator shared that Joan Caruso would like to come to an agreement with the Commissioners to end the grievance process that started over a year ago and avoid arbitration. The Commissioners reached consensus that the County followed good management practice and complied with the collective bargaining contract in the hiring process. The Commissioners believe it would be a bad precedent if they agreed to give a regrade given the aforementioned. The Administrator will discuss regrades as part of the negotiations of the next contract meetings.
