PLYMOUTH COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING

June 3, 2021

A regular meeting of the Plymouth County Commissioners was called to order at 5:00 p.m. at the County of Plymouth Administration Building, 44 Obery Street, Plymouth, MA. Present were Commissioner Sandra M. Wright and Commissioner Jared L. Valanzola. Also, in attendance were Treasurer Thomas O'Brien, Deputy Treasurer Jeff Welch, Register of Deeds John Buckley, 4-H Director Molly Vollmer, County Attorney Shannon Resnick, County Administrator Frank Basler, and Executive Assistant Nancy O'Rourke.

Commissioner Wright called for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Vote to accept and approve CPS Forms:

Commissioner Valanzola made a motion to accept and approve the personnel status forms listed. Commissioner Wright seconded.

Vote: The motion passed unanimously.

CARES Act: update and possible distribution votes

Commissioner Valanzola made a motion to approve reimbursements in the amount of \$406.00 to Murphy, Hesse Toomey & Lehane, LLP for Administrative Support. Commissioner Wright seconded.

Vote: The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer O'Brien reports the Commissioners have approved over 100 submission packets in the past 3 weeks. The Towns of Hanover, Marshfield, Mattapoisett, Norwell, Plympton, and Scituate are all at their cap. The Towns of Bridgewater, Hanson, Middleborough, and Wareham have not reached 50% of the cap. Treasurer O'Brien will reach out to those towns at the end of this month to inquire as to the cause of the delay in submissions.

Approximately 18 million has been requested by the State for reimbursements for expenses in Plymouth County from March 2020 to December 2020. The Treasurer will not be reimbursing those expenses.

Additional funds will be needed to the Town of Marshfield and the City of Brockton for COVID-19 Regional Vaccination Programs.

American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA)-discussion and possible votes

Treasurer O'Brien briefed the board on recent statements by the legislature in the media regarding the states handling of CARES Act funds and guidelines for the ARPA program are still being updated. Commissioner Valanzola feels most of the member communities in Plymouth County would like the county to accept the funds and oversee the program for them. The Treasurer expressed his concern as to possible liabilities to the county and although a team is in place to administer the program, he requested additional time before a decision is made by the board with a formal vote. Commissioner Valanzola agreed to allowing additional time for more guidance from the Federal Government and the Treasurer's team.

Plymouth County Personnel Handbook-Discussion and Vote

Attorney Resnick presented a draft handbook with updates and changes. Administrator Basler would like to include Tammy Correa HR Administrative Assistant in additional discussions on changes and to provide historical background on the original handbook.

At 5:55 p.m. the meeting was adjourned.
